Endangered Species Updates

Endangered Species in Construction

- Pay attention to special provisions.
- Working to improve consistency and clarity of environmental special provisions.
- Common examples:
 - Migratory birds
 - In-stream work restrictions
 - Seasonal timing restrictions





Bat Updates

Northern Long-Eared Bat (NLEB)

- Reclassified as endangered in January 2023.
- Notable requirement: winter tree clearing (November 1 to March 31)
 - Completed ahead of construction by county forces or ID/IQ
 - Included in construction contract
 - Challenges and lessons learned

















Bat Updates

Tricolored Bat (TCB)

- FWS is proposing to list the tricolored bat as endangered.
 - Effective date TBD
- Likely similar avoidance and minimization measures as NLEB.
- WisDOT actively preparing for the anticipated listing.

In compliance with the provisions of ch. 283, Wis. Stats., chs. NR 151 and 216, Wis. Adm. Code, and s. 30.2022 (2), Wis. Stats., the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT) engaging in land disturbing construction activities including clearing and grubbing, filling, grading and/or excavating, but excluding storm water discharges within Indian Country, that discharges

STORM WATER ASSOCIATED WITH LAND DISTURBING CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY

is authorized to discharge storm water to waters of the state provided that the discharge is in accordance with the conditions set forth in this permit, the

TRANSPORTATION CONSTRUCTION GENERAL PERMIT.

HazMat Program Updates

- Monitoring state and federal activity related to PFAS
- Participating in DNR Remediation and Redevelopment Program Rules Advisory Committee related to potential revisions in chs. NR 700-799.

What are PFAS?

PFAS (per- and poly-fluoroalkyl substances) are synthetic chemicals that do not occur naturally. Strong carbon-fluorine bonds in PFAS make them resistant to degradation and thus highly persistent in the environment. Industry uses PFAS to make a wide variety of products such as apparel, paper, plastics, and food packaging.







Mandatory Disposal Contracts

- Mandatory disposal contracts for:
 - Lamps, ballast, bulbs
 - Mercury containing switches
 - Hazardous waste
 - Tank sludge from underground or above ground petroleum storage tanks
 - Bridge paint waste

- Contractor Responsibility:
 - Construction & demolition waste
 - Solid waste (nonrecyclable) paper, glass, metal, other debris)


